All drivers of towboats, pick-up boats and any other watercraft volunteering in a Wake On Water event must comply with and meet all licensing requirements for operating a watercraft in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

In addition, any owner and/or operator of a watercraft in a Wake On Water event must complete this form and provide the documents requested below.

Standard Rules for Providing and/or Operating a Watercraft during a Wake On Water, Inc. event.

1. All watercraft registration shall be current. (Attach a copy to this application.)
 2. All watercraft shall be insured. Proof of insurance shall be provided to Wake On Water, Inc. prior to participation in a Wake On Water, Inc. (Attach a copy to this application.)
 3. All operators shall have a current boat operator license recognized by the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries. (Attach a copy to this application.)
 4. All watercraft shall be in full compliance with the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries rules and regulations.

1. All boat occupants under the age of 13 shall wear a properly fitted life jacket at all times when the boat is underway. This is consistent with Federal law.
2. When loading and/or unloading passengers or equipment the boat shall be at rest and the motor SHALL be turned OFF.
3. When water sport participants are getting into or out of the boat for any purpose, the boat shall be at rest and the motor SHALL be turned OFF.
4. All water sport participants shall wear a properly fitted life jacket and a water sports helmet while wakeboarding, knee boarding, or water skiing.
5. All participants shall wear a properly fitted life jacket while riding in or on a towable tube.
6. All life jackets shall be U.S. Coast Guard approved and in good condition.
7. Maximum speed limits when operating as a tow-boat are as follows:
 - a. Wakeboarding – Generally, 16 – 19; Maximum 22 mph
 - b. Kneeboarding – Generally 16 – 19; Maximum 20 mph
 - c. Water skis – Combo 25 mph; Slalom 19 – 36 mph
 - d. Zup board- 12-18 mph
